We will respond within 24 hours of a snowfall ending, as well as every 24 hours during a continuous snowfall. We regularly complete site checks to monitor drifts and to keep ice from building up. **Please be aware that slip hazards can exist at times between our visits. You may have access to ice melt or gravel bins on your site to help prevent this.**

### Typical Snow Storm Schedule

**Day 1: Prioritize efficiently creating safe pathways.**

**Day 2/3: Return to widen pathways and perfect the edges.**

### What We Need From You:

- **Electrical Hazards:** Please do not leave extension cords across walkways. We cannot see them under the snow and our machines will eat them up. This is extremely dangerous and the cords will not be replaced.
- **Parking:** Please do not park in designated snow pile areas. There are limited spaces for snow, and some visitor parking spots may be used. Cars may be towed if necessary.
- **Caution:** Please use caution around machinery and **do not allow children outside when the plow is operating, or to play on or in the snow piles, as they both present safety hazards.** Please do not drive closely behind machinery as we may back up unexpectedly.
- **Ice Melt/ Gravel:** On-site ice melt/sand/gravel bins may be available for resident use.
